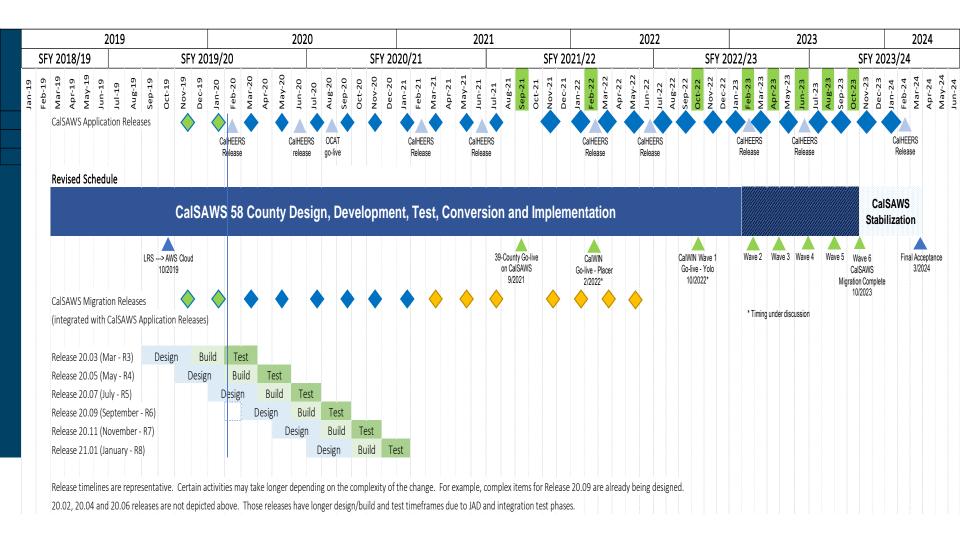

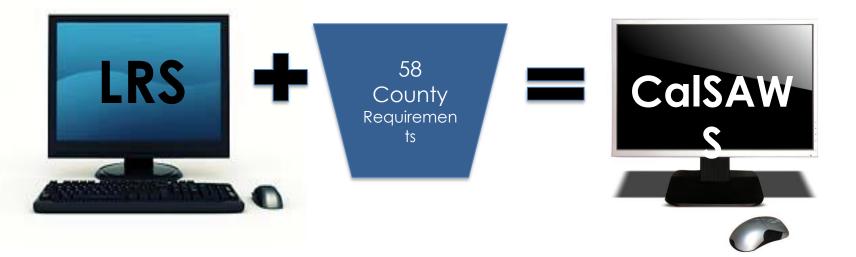

Legislative Briefing Fast Facts - Journey to CalSAWS

- Federal mandate to expand LRS to all 58 Counties by the end of calendar year 2023.
- LRS was implemented in Los Angeles in 2016 with the expectation that it would become the foundation for the Statewide System.
- Modifications must be made to make LRS a 58 County System with functionality and flexibility to serve all counties.

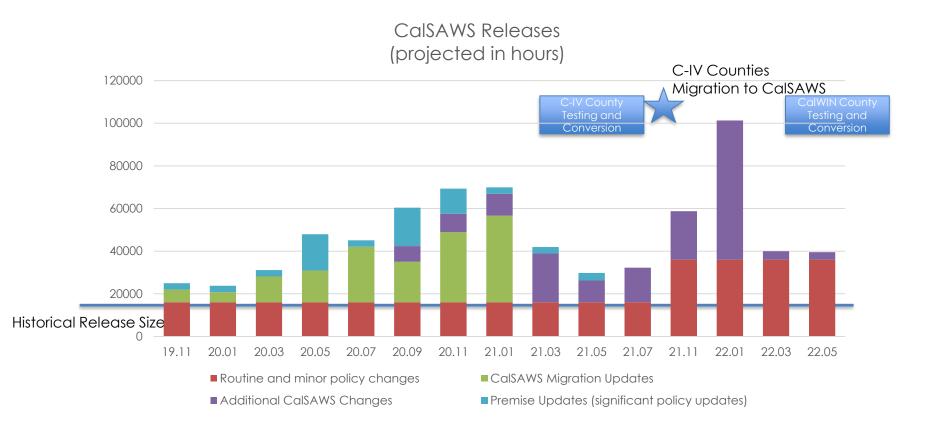

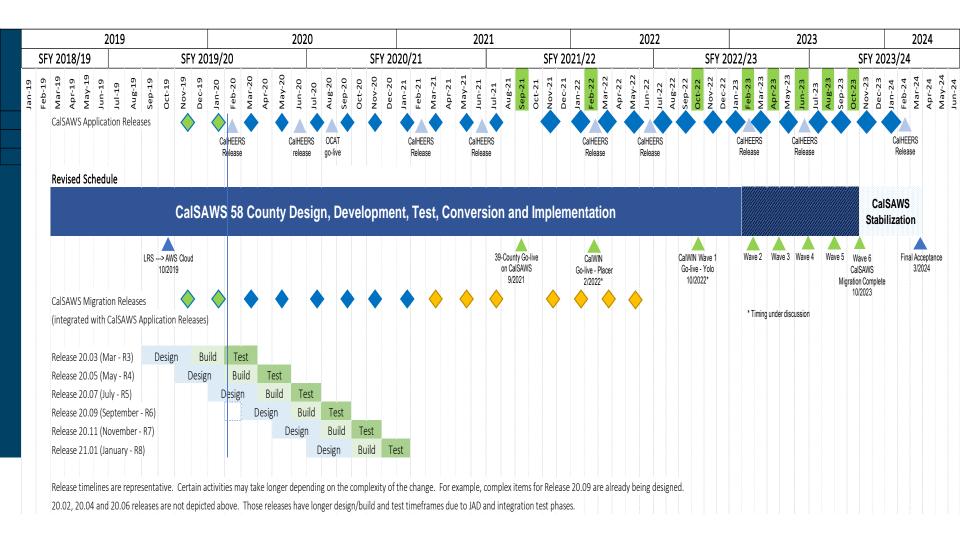

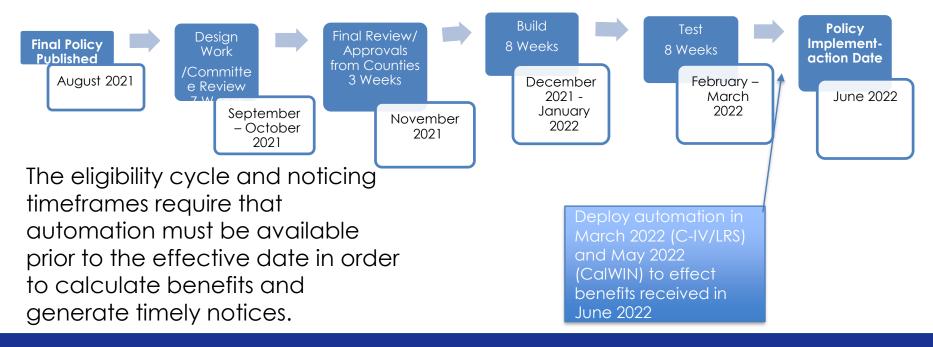

Policy effective date vs automation implementation date

Dependencies:

- Policy Guidance: clear & complete final State Policy, including notices translated into all threshold languages, quick turn-around on follow up questions
- Coordination with Other Changes: other changes underway; multiple releases are always in progress, so automation activities cannot always start immediately
- **Competing Priorities**: each system has an active set of requested changes that averages around 150
- **Scheduling**: LRS/C-IV Releases occur in odd numbered months at last full week of the month; CalWIN's are quarterly in the first half of the months of Feb., May, Aug., & Nov.

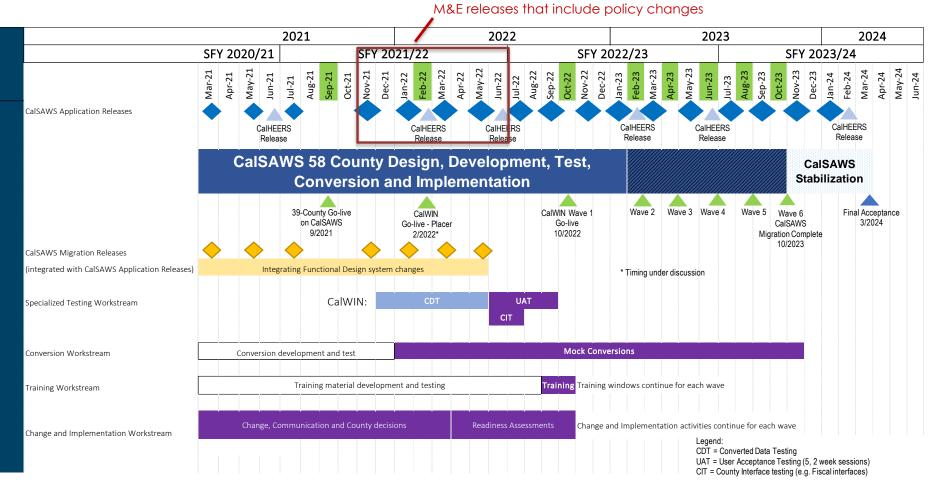

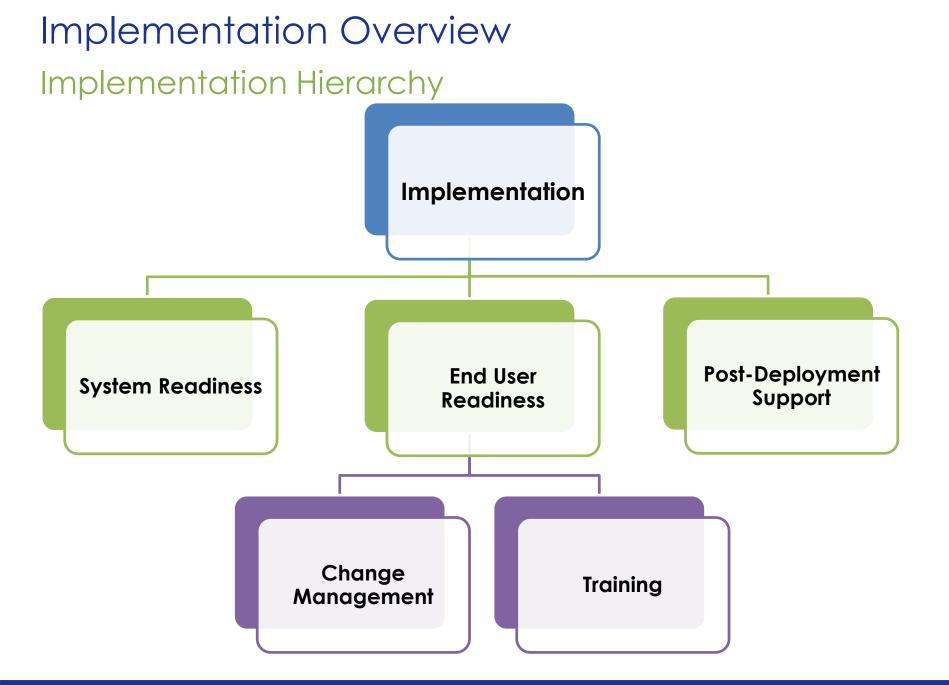

Data Validation of the Data Cleansing Report

- Generated Draft Reports in November, December, and January and Distributed to the Validation Team for Review
- Facilitated Validation Review meetings (in the same months) with the Validation Team
 - Discussed Modifications to the Reports
 - Receive Feedback
- This month, the team plans to:
 - Generate another report (mid-February)
 - Distribute to the Validation Team (mid-February)
 - Facilitate Validation Review meeting (End of February)
- It is the team's plan that Duplicate Person Data Cleansing Reports will be ready for distribution by April 2020
- The one remaining item for conversation (with the PSC members) is the Business Process by which the Counties will work with these reports. This discussion is planned for the March PSC meeting.



CDSS has directed counties to apply the discretionary exemptions for non-exempt ABAWDS for the months of April and May 2020 and send out applicable Notices and ABAWD screening tool. *CalSAWS Next Steps:*

02/19/2020:

1. Turn on ABAWD logic for non-waived counties with a begin date of 04/01/2020.

2. Automatically update the ABAWD Time Limit Clock records for non-exempt ABAWDS who are not meeting the work requirements and create the discretionary exemption for April and May 2020.

3. Run EDBC for April and May 2020

4. The system will suppress the CF 377.11B CalFresh Countable Month notice for all counties.

<u>3/21/2020:</u>

- Batch process will generate the following notices for all non waived counties except Marin: CF 377.11C (CalFresh Informational Notice CalFresh Time Limit for ABAWDs) CF 377.11E (CalFresh ABAWD Time Limit Exemption Screening form, with a single Cover letter)
- 2. Batch process will generate the CF 377.11D (CalFresh Discretionary Exemption for ABAWD) for all non-waived counties including Marin County.
- 3. Provide a list of ABAWDs that received a discretionary exemption. The list will be provided on 2/20, 5/1 and 6/1.

After **03/21/2020**, the system will continue to automatically apply the discretionary exemption for non-exempt ABAWDs for the months of April and May 2020; however, it will be the worker's responsibility to manually generate a CF 377.11D from the template repository and mail it with the 377.11C and 377.11E as needed for new applicants or when a recipient loose an exemption. The CF 377.11C, CF 377.11D and CF 377.11E will be available in the template repository.

CalSAWS Outreach:

- Schedule an ABAWD functionality demo and click through for counties. This will take place in late February. For more information, refer to CRFI 20-006 sent on 1/29/2020.
- Inform the counties of existing ABAWD system training materials.
- CalSAWS finalize the design for Phase III ABAWD changes.

CalWIN Next Steps:

February 2020

- Apply Discretionary Exemption effective April 1, 2020 for the 5 existing ABAWD counties: Alameda, Contra Costa, San Francisco, San Mateo and Santa Clara. Mass update will be applied to individuals that have a Not Working (NW) Clock. ABAWD Notices will be suppressed for these counties. Note: Fresno and Tulare will continue the ABAWD Waiver.
 - Target implementation date: 3rd week of February.

March 2020

- Apply the process to end the ABAWD waiver for 11 CalWIN counties, effective 4/1/20. Followed up by a mass update process to apply the Discretionary Exemption effective April 1, 2020 to individuals that do not have a work registration exemption, ABAWD exemption or meeting work requirements. ABAWD notices will be suppressed.
- Conversion will be run for all ABAWD cases/individuals for the 11 new CalWIN counties.
 - Target implementation date: Mid-March 2020.

Spanish Translation Process

Currently, all English content for outbound correspondence (Forms/NOAs, Email, Text Messages, IVR, Mobile App) including Kiosk and Self-Service Portal is translated into Spanish by the CalSAWS project analysts and reviewed and approved by the County Spanish User group.

The Spanish translation process takes approximately 3 weeks. The project has worked with the CalSAWS translation vendor, United Language Group (ULG), to streamline the translation process to receive all threshold translations back from ULG within about a week. ULG has confirmed that they have capability to adjust the tone of the translated text to reflect the level of comprehension of a 6th grade reader to meet the Turner requirements.

Spanish Translation Process

- Effective March 1, 2020, the CalSAWS Project will provide one English version to be translated in all threshold translations to ULG.
- All customer correspondence will be translated by ULG.
- Disband the Spanish Translation User group.

FCED Status and Governance



Solution Overview

- Phase 1 Solution Overview Draft
 - LA County retains their current CWS/CMS interface and data mart process. The available timeline does not allow for reworking LA's business processes and other uses of the CWS/CMS file in time to have the functionality in place at the C-IV cutover, so LA's process will remain separate for Phase 1.
 - 57 Counties will leverage a new CWS/CMS interface based on the LA County interface. The interface will be sent directly from the CWS/CMS System to the CalSAWS System.
 - Update a subset of CalSAWS Foster Care eligibility rules.
 - Update online data collection pages to add additional data elements.
 - Utilize existing CalSAWS FC NOAs, forms, and reports.

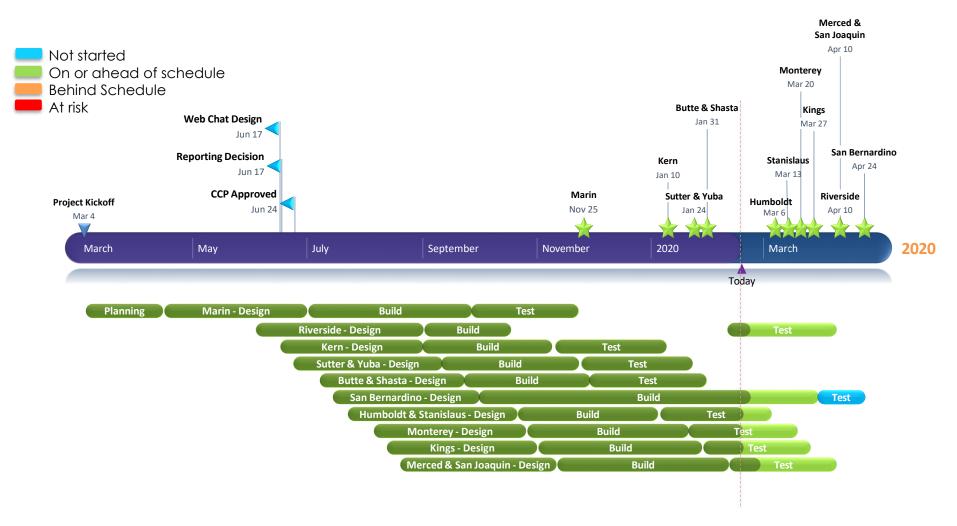

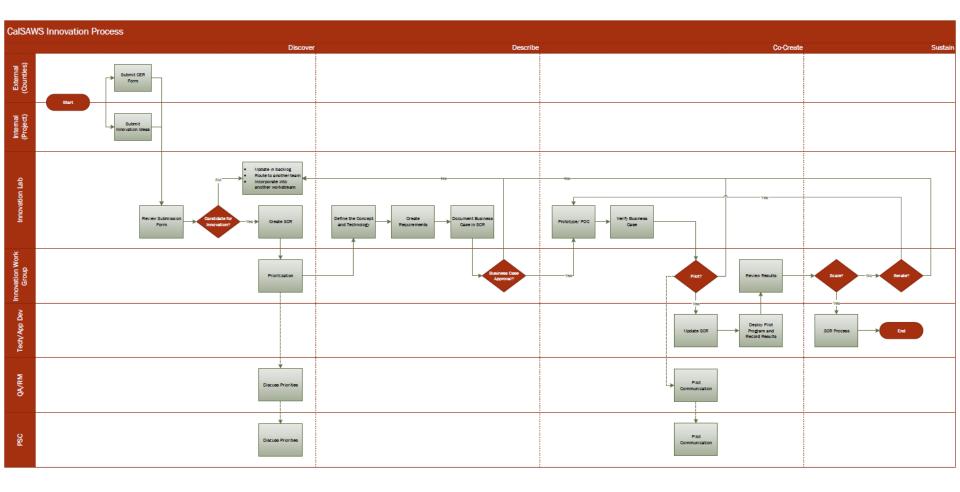

DESCRIPTION	Delphix is a third party tool used to mask data, decrease the time needed to refresh data, and reduce storage costs for non-production environments in the cloud. This tool has not performed as expected for the system test environments and is causing the project to use more AWS compute resources than planned.
