EDBC in CalSAWS

EDBC can be run for up to 6 Months

Unlike CalWIN, in CalSAWS, EDBC can only be run for up to six months at a time. If EDBC needs to be run for more than six months, it must be run multiple times. Users have the option to change the months EDBC is run for.*

How CalSAWS Defaults the Begin and End Date for EDBC

Applications

The Begin Month defaults to the application month and the End Month defaults to the come-up month.

Ongoing Cases


The system looks at several factors for the suggested Begin Month:

- What is the earliest month there is a recorded data change?
- Is there a pending program?
- If none of these apply, CalSAWS suggests the come-up month.

The End Month cannot be further in the future than the come-up month.

*EDBC cannot be run past the come-up month.

Running EDBC for Multiple Programs



CalSAWS provides users the option to run eligibility on a single program or multiple programs at the same time.

On the **Run EDBC** page users select which program(s) they want to run before clicking **Run EDBC**.

Soft vs. Hard Validation

If there is missing information in the data collection pages and/or outstanding verifications, the user will receive some validation messages after clicking the Run EDBC button.

Soft Validation: CalSAWS will still allow the worker to run and accept EDBC, however it may impact EDBC results.

Examples include:

- Immunization Records
- Missing School
 Attendance Information

Hard Validation: CalSAWS will NOT allow the worker to run and accept the EDBC results. The Run EDBC button will not display.
