


### **GENERAL ANALYSIS**

There is currently one open issue within the SharePoint Issue log for this reporting period.










Figure 10verall Risk Level and Numerical Analysis

## RISK 102 - LACK OF ANNUAL PROJECT FUNDING MAY CAUSE SCHEDULE DELAY OR REDUCTION IN SCOPE FOR CALSAWS & OTHER PROJECTS

#### **LATEST STATUS NOTES**

- Aug 8, 2025: HR1 was passed with impact to funding participation rates, increasing the State's share of cost. Direction from the State on updates to the CAP is pending but increases the probability of this risk due to impacts on State general fund. CPMO continues to monitor and address questions/comments associated with OAPDU review and approval.
- July 1, 2025: January 2025 IAPDU was approved and the OAPDU was submitted for State review and approval. CPMO continues to monitor potential State and federal budget impacts.
- May 29, 2025: CPMO confirmed the May Revise as released on May 14th was as expected. CMS approved the January 2025 IAPDU on May 22, 2025. FNS approval is pending. CPMO continues to monitor State and federal budget plans to identify potential impacts.

- Aug 8, 2025: Alternatives analysis has continued to compare products. CPMO reviewed protype developed by Gainwell to provide feedback for expanded demonstration with the Consortium. ## RISK 312 - DELAYS IN COMPLETING REQUIREMENTS AND DESIGN FOR SINGLE STREAMLINE APPLICATION (SSAPP) MAY IMPACT CALSAWS DELIVERY AND SUPPORT

#### **DESCRIPTION**

The Online Single Streamline Application(SSApp), through the California Healthcare Eligibility, Enrollment and Retention System (CalHEERS) portal, is planned to be delivered in September 2025 to meet Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services(CMS) and State regulations.

The delivery of these changes includes updates to CalSAWS, BenefitsCal, CalHEERS, and MEDS. Completion of CalHEERS requirements and design is delayed two weeks due to the late addition of this effort to the 25.9 CalHEERS Release. Due to the late addition, this change requires expedited design, review, and approval.

Breadth of requirement impact on various systems include CalSAWS, BenefitsCal, CoveredCA, and MEDS.

## RISK 315 - ABSENCE OF A FINALIZED 2026 CALHEERS RELEASE SCHEDULE MAY CREATE CHALLENGES FOR CALSAWS TO DELIVER CALHEERS-DESIGNATED CHANGES

### DESCRIPTION

Every year, California Healthcare Eligibility, Enrollment and Retention System (CalHEERS) and CalSAWS Project performs an annual review of the prioritized changes for the upcoming year. This process facilitates planning and coordination of upcoming changes to accommodate Joint Application Design, Build, and Test activities within a 12-month timeframe. Three (3) integrated CalSAWS/CalHEERS releases are planned for 2026: 26.2, 26.6, and 26.9. Requested 2026 CalHEERS changes, with CalSAWS impacts, was larger than historical years. In addition, DHCS requested an additional release to support Verify Lawful Presence Service changes. DHCS, CalHEERS, CalSAWS are conducting sessions to plan out the entirety of 2026 taking in consideration CalSAWS M&E Transition, CMS Requirements, and on-going DHCS policy prioritization. CalSAWS' ability to deliver 2026 CalHEERS designated changes may be at risk without a finalized CalHEERS release schedule.

## RISK 317 - UPDATED MAY REVISE BUDGET MEDI-CAL REVISIONS EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2026 MAY BE AT RISK FOR DELIVERY

As part of the State Fiscal Year 2025/2026 Revised Budget, two policy updates are expected to be implemented by January 1, 2026. These policy updates are the (1) Full-Scope Medi-Cal Enrollment Freeze for Non-Satisfactory Immigration Status and (2) Reinstatement of the Non-MAGI Medi-Cal Asset Limit Test. The Enrollment Freeze update will require coordination between the CalSAWS and CalHEERS Project. The implementation of these changes should not conflict with the SSA COLA Batch Run planned for December 2025. Without finalized staffing, policy, timeline, and environment plan, the delivery and implementation of these policy updates might be at risk. ## RISK 321 - UNCERTAINTY ON APPROACH FOR TRANSMITTING VENDOR INFORMATION TO CALSAWS MAY IMPACT LARGE COUNTY AUTOMATION

### DESCRIPTION

During development of the FCED/CARES APIs, the CalSAWS project identified a concern with the proposed approach for sharing vendor information from the CARES system. The CalSAWS approach is that vendors, which are stored in the Resource Data Bank (RDB), are designed to be entered once and then associated to cases that are using that vendor. CARES Vendor = CalSAWS Foster Care Resource, which becomes the Placement and payee on the Foster Care program. The CARES project approach is to store vendor information at the case level, which will duplicate data across cases that use the same vendor. The approach would require county staff to coordinate updates to RBD across all placements that utilize it. This could mean coordination across offices within a single county or coordination across multiple counties if a CalSAWS Foster Care Resource is servicing multiple cases across counties. The CalSAWS FCED team suggested creating a separate Vendor API to share vendor information separate from the Placement data. This approach would prevent vendor data for the same resource being sent for each case that uses it. The CARES project has yet to agree to a Vendor API approach which puts the development of large county automation at risk due to the uncertain final design of the logic. Additionally, the lack of final approach makes it increasingly likely that the CalSAWS Deloitte team will be getting the automation logic half completed during transition instead of complete, as planned. If the Vendor API fails to be built prior to initial implementation of the FCED interface, counties will be required to take significant manual steps to create the vendor in Resource Data Bank (RDB) prior to processing any placement information from CARES. Beyond the manual effort, this could delay benefits to customers while the manual processing of resource data takes place.

# ISSUE 318 - CARES KIN-GAP AND ADOPTION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (AAP) CONVERSION APPROACH REQUIRES SIGNIFICANT MANUAL DATA CONVERSION AND/OR DATA ENTRY EFFORT BY THE COUNTIES

DESCRIPTION	OWNERS
The conversion approach that the CARES project has put forward assumes that enough case data for Kin-GAP and Adoption Assistance Program (AAP) programs exist in CWS/CMS or can be derived from existing data to create a shell case. Discussions to synchronize CalSAWS AAP and Kin-GAP case data that may be missing from CWS/CMS have yet to be resolved with CARES in a positive outcome, increasing the level of manual work staff will undertake to make the case whole and synchronize the data in both CARES and CalSAWS systems The CARES-FCED Foster Care program conversion approach was previously approved. The initial Foster Care data extract from the CARES project was received on July 1, 2025. The match rate for CalSAWS cases and individuals was extremely low. CalSAWS' analysis and reconciliation of the extract indicate that the approved conversion approach for Foster Care should be revisited, as it may be more complex than initially anticipated—both for the project and potentially for county staff. Given that Foster Care is the primary eligibility program tracked through FCED, with more detailed data available in CWS/CMS, the low match rate highlights a misalignment in expectations regarding CARES data extraction, deduplication, and formatting. ### **CURRENT ISSUE RESOLUTION PLAN**

Weekly conversion discussions with CARES to identify a path forward for Conversion which will require the least amount of manual entry by county staff have identified three possible outcomes. Kin-GAP and AAP Conversion Options:

• The CARES project has suggested that utilization of the APIs to do most of the conversion is the best option. The CalSAWS project disagrees with this approach because there are too

- many concerns with using the APIs to perform high volume data synchronization when they were designed to send daily update volume only
- The CalSAWS project has suggested that CARES do a full ingestion of the eligibility data pulled from CalSAWS to give the most data possible to the CARES system to avoid a need for any downstream data conversions or manual entry. CARES has objected to this approach due to resource constraints/time/etc. Additionally, they have indicated that there is concern for data desynchronization due to some counties' timelines for adopting CARES as the system for Social Services Workers to track Kin-GAP and AAP cases.
- The CalSAWS project has requested the absolute minimum number of data points that the CARES project would need to establish a link to CalSAWS and still have enough data to continue day-to-day business so that the CARES project can ingest that information from a CalSAWS extract. This approach is still in discussion. With this solution CARES has also indicated that there is concern for data desynchronization due to some countries' timelines for adopting CARES as the system for Social Services Workers to track Kin-GAP and AAP cases.
