1 OVERVIEW

Update CF EDBC to ignore 10-Day adequate notice logic when the EDBC run includes the Pending Intake months.

1.1 Current Design

When running a multi-month EDBC on an Intake application on or after 10-day NOA cut-off, the system applies 10-day adequate notice logic. As a result, when the user enters SSI/SSP, SSI Only, or SSP Only income starting in the month after the application month, the system delays the benefit change until the come-up month (i.e., the second month after the application month), instead of applying it in the immediate next month. This behavior occurs even though all months in the EDBC run are still Pending, and the case is not yet accepted.

1.2 Requests

Update EDBC to ignore 10-day NOA logic for all months processed during a CF multi-month EDBC run when the run includes the Pending/Intake month, and the income type is one of the following:

- SSI/SSP
- SSI Only
- SSP Only

This will ensure that benefit changes are applied starting from the immediate next month, not delayed to the come-up month (i.e., the second month after the application month).

1.3 Overview of Recommendations

1. Update EDBC logic to apply all changes for all months in a CF multi-month EDBC run that includes the Pending/Intake month, without applying 10-day NOA cut-off logic, when the income type is SSI/SSP, SSI Only, or SSP Only.

1.4 Assumptions

1. This SCR change will apply to initial intake applications only, not for ongoing cases.
2. CalWORKs will remain unchanged. For intake scenarios, SSI/SSP, SSI Only, and SSP Only information is applied without requiring 10-day NOA.
3. There is no effective date for the changes added with this SCR. A re-run of a past EDBC may result in a benefit change.

4. Prior cases are not expected to be reviewed or updated as part of this implementation.

2.2 Update Eligibility Rules

2.2.1 Overview

Update CF EDBC to ignore 10-day adequate notice logic when the EDBC run includes the Pending Intake month, and the income type is SSI/SSP, SSI Only, or SSP Only.

2.2.2 Description of Changes

1. Update EDBC to apply all changes without delaying benefit changes due to 10-day notice logic when the following are true:
 - a. The program is CF.
 - b. The run is a multi-month EDBC that includes the Pending Intake month.
 - c. The income type added is SSI/SSP, SSI Only, or SSP Only.
 - d. The EDBC is run during the 10-day NOA cut-off.

2.2.3 Example Scenario

Note: The scenarios below are not requirements. They are intended to help with understanding and testing and may reference items that are not being changed by the specific language in the requirements.

Case Scenario:

1. A CF application is received on 10/01/2025.
2. The application is still Pending.
3. The customer reports SSI/SSP income starting 11/01/2025. The worker runs a multi-month EDBC on 10/25/2025 for October through December.

Current Behavior: The system applies 10-day notice logic and delays the benefit change until December 2025 (i.e., the second month after the application month), even though the income starts in November.

Proposed Behavior: The system ignores 10-day notice logic. The SSI/SSP income is applied starting in November 2025, and the benefit is adjusted accordingly.
